1. PARK HYATT BANGKOK

Project Overview

Park Hyatt Bangkok is housed in the top 24 floors of the iconic, twisted-coil structure atop the Central Embassy shopping center. Designed by Yabu Pushelberg, the 5-star hotel has 222 guestrooms, including 32 premier suites, all with floor-to-ceiling windows presenting city views. Starting at 48 sqm, the entry-level rooms rank among the largest in the city. All rooms and suites are equipped with modern and stylish interior design combined with timeless Thai accents. Spanning the 34th, 35th and 36th floors, the complex will include a grill restaurant, cocktail bar, speakeasy bar, VIP mezzanine lounge and a sky bar.



Sleek lines, smooth curves, and stunning art everywhere.


