## 1. HOTEL PERLE D'ORIENT CAT BA

### Project Overview

Hôtel Perle d'Orient Cat Ba by MGallery is the first international luxury property on Cat Ba Island. Cat Ba is considered the adventure tourism capital of Vietnam, known for its sporting activities such as kayaking, rock climbing, trekking and mountain biking. It is also an ideal vantage point from which to explore Ha Long Bay, famous for its towering limestone islands topped by rainforests. Main design feature of the hotel is the rooftop which features an open-concept layout modelled after traditional Vietnamese homes. Each of the 121 guestrooms have been designed with neoclassical furnishings to encapsulate the spirit of the heyday Indochine era – from high quality hardwood floors, old-style claw foot bathtubs, rattan wicker chairs, and traditional ceiling fans to intricate wall tilting patterns.
